The Director



Josh Jackson is currently in his eleventh year as the Director of Choral Activities at Chatfield Senior High School in Littleton, Colorado, where he directs all vocal ensembles, teaches AP Music Theory, and is also the Music Director/Producer of Chatfield's annual spring musical. Josh is an active musician, serving as the assistant director and one of the co-founders of Elus Vocal Ensemble (previously known as the Denver Pro Chorale).

Josh received his Bachelor of Music Education degree from Metropolitan State University of Denver, specializing in Choral studies and Voice under the mentorship of Dr. Michael Kornelsen and MB Krueger. He has worked with students at all levels from around the Denver Metro Area and has been the Vocal Music Director for musicals in the Douglas County School District, Adams 12 School District, and Jefferson County School District. Josh was the student producer for MSU Denver's annual Choral Celebration festival — where he coordinated schedules for

hundreds of high school choral performers around the state.

Josh is active in the music education field; serving on the board for the Colorado American Choral Director's Association (COACDA) for the past twelve years, and the Colorado All State Choir Governing Board for the past eight years. Josh is an active accompanist around the state — working with public schools, choir concerts, All-State auditions, and Solo & Ensemble contests. In addition to teaching, Josh is also active in the field of Information Technology. For the past fifteen years, he has been the Director of Information Technology for RJH Consultants, Inc., a geotechnical engineering firm in Englewood, Colorado. Josh currently resides in cozy Castle Rock, Colorado with his husband Matt and their sidekicks Westin, Sasha and "Little Bits."

The Accompanist



Marvel Dow is a retired Vocal Music Instructor from Summit Ridge Middle School. She has been an accompanist in Jefferson County high schools, middle schools, and elementary schools since 1999, serving at Dakota Ridge High School, D'Evelyn High School, and currently at Chatfield Senior High School under Mr. Josh Jackson. Marvel has received two Bachelors of Arts degrees in the Denver area. The first degree was a Bachelor of Arts in Biblical Studies with a minor in Sacred Music at what is now Colorado Christian University and the most recent was a Bachelor of Arts in Music Education from Metropolitan State University of Denver with a Choral emphasis. She studied voice and conducting with MB Krueger and was a member of the Metropolitan Chorale under Dr. Michael Kornelsen. Much of Marvel's adult life has been in music ministry. She has conducted choirs and ensembles of various ages and acted in and directed musicals as part of a church ministry. She was worship leader for several Denver area churches. She sang for an internationally syndicated radio program out of Lincoln, NE for several years as well. Accompanying has been a very important part of her life since grade school and she loves working with students at school, All-State auditions and at Solo and Ensemble. Marvel is married to David Dow and together they have 6

married children and 16 grandchildren. The Dows reside in Lakewood, Colorado.

The Pencussionist



Kevin Keith is a freelance musician and educator based in Denver, Colorado. A strong advocate for new music and progressive music education, he enjoys spending his time in various teaching and performing opportunities in and around the Denver metropolitan area. He also actively teaches and performs in Minnesota, Illinois, and Michigan. Kevin holds a Bachelor of Music Education from Central Michigan University, a Master of Music Performance from Michigan State University, and is currently pursuing an Artist Diploma at the Lamont School of Music at the University of Denver.

As a performer, Kevin is active in chamber, orchestral and solo percussion. He has performed with the Colorado Symphony, Denver Philharmonic, Aurora Symphony, Boulder Symphony, Broomfield Symphony, Mason

Symphony, Great Lakes Chamber and Lansing Symphony Orchestras as a percussionist and timpanist. He has been a featured member of the Colorado College Summer Music Festival Orchestra and Chosen Vale Seminar Percussion Ensemble. Kevin has performed as a featured solo artist at events such as the McCormick Marimba Festival in Tampa, Florida and Electronic Music Midwest in Chicago, Illinois. He has also been a featured soloist with the Michigan State University Percussion Ensemble, Central Michigan University Symphony Orchestra and the Lansing Symphony Orchestra. He is an advocate of new works for percussion and electronics, having premiered or commissioned works by composers such as Ryan Elvert, Justin Rito, and Alejandro Viñao. As a chamber artist, Kevin currently works as a member of the Front Range Duo with Stephen Bott in commissioning new music in percussion in the mountain region of the United States. He is also a member of Transition Theater, an upstart multimedia theater troupe based in Denver.

Kevin's instructing duties include the Director of Percussion position at Chatfield Senior High School in Littleton, CO and as an instructor of percussion at Denver East High School and Standley Lake High School. His students have received superior ranks in Solo & Ensemble competitions, as well as placing into music institutes or summer events such as the Interlochen Arts Academy and the Legends Drum and Bugle Corps.
